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1 INTRODUCTION

This Information Manual is issued by Diopoint (Pty) Ltd (“the Company”) in terms of Section 51 of the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 and in compliance with the Protection of the Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 together with the regulations thereto, published under Government Notice R1383 in Government Gazette 42110 dated 14 December 2018.

2 PURPOSE OF THE PAIA ACT

The Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 and Protection of the Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 aim to balance the right to privacy of a Data Subject against other rights, particularly the right of access to Information and by setting the minimum standard to be followed for the Processing of Information to be lawful.

The promotion of Access to Information Act, 2000 (the “Act”) gives third parties the right to approach private bodies and the government to request information held by them, which is required in the exercise and/or protection of any rights. On request, the private body or government is obliged to release such information unless the Act expressly states that the records containing such information may or must not be released. This manual informs requestors of procedural and other requirements that a request must meet as prescribed by the Act.

3 PURPOSE OF THE PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT, 2013

The purpose of the Protection of the Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 is to give effect to the constitutional right to privacy, by safeguarding Information when processed by the Company.

Through the scope of products and services that Diopoint renders, the company is by default involved in the collection, use and disclosure of certain aspects of personal information of clients, employees, suppliers and other stakeholders.

A person’s right to privacy entails having control over his/her personal information and therefore Diopoint is committed to effectively manage that information in accordance with POPIA’s provisions.

4 PURPOSE OF THIS MANUAL

This manual will assist members of the public to manage the Processing of their Information by providing:

- a. details of the categories of Information that the Company holds;
- b. how this Information is Processed by the Company;
- c. the manner in which such Information may be accessed and grounds for refusal of access to such Information; and
- d. the manner of objecting to the Processing of Information and requesting a correction of Information Processed by the Company.



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When a member of the public interacts with the Company in person, by electronic communication or through the Company's website, they agree to the terms and conditions set out in this Information Manual and the Company's Privacy Policy.

The Company reserves the right to update the terms of this Information Manual from time to time and to publish such updated Information Manual on its website.

Any person may contact the Information Officer of the Company to obtain a copy of the most recent version of the Information Manual.

13.2 The listing of the Information kept by the Company does not mean that all such Information is available to the public. Certain Information listed above is protected from disclosure in terms of legislation. Any disclosure of requested Information will be

subject to the request procedure as detailed in clause 20 below and the grounds for refusal stipulated in clause 21 below.

13.3 The Company will only collect and retain such Information of a Data Subject as is necessary for the continued operation and management of the Company and for the rendering of the services as provided by the Company.

13.4 Anyone whose Information is held by the Company or where a Data Subject has provided their written consent to the processing of their Information, the Data Subject has the right to submit a request to the Company to withdraw his or her consent or to object to the Processing of his or her Information on reasonable grounds. Such request must be submitted on prescribed Form 1 of the POPI Regulations, which is available on request from the Information Officer.

14 PURPOSE OF THE PROCESSING PERSONAL INFORMATION KEPT BY THE COMPANY

14.1 The Company may process the Information detailed in clause 13 above for the following purposes:

- 14.1.1 to comply with business and tax legislation;
- 14.1.2 for retention of records as required by any law, e.g. fraud and crime detection and prevention;
- 14.1.3 for retention of records required in terms of an agreement with a third party, i.e. service level agreement;
- 14.1.4 to render services to customers;
- 14.1.5 to conduct due diligence checks on employees, customers and service providers, e.g. credit checks, SAPS Clearance information check references;
- 14.1.6 to obtain professional advice, e.g. from legal counsel or auditors / accountants;
- 14.1.7 employee management;
- 14.1.8 facilitate the collection of fees for the services provided by the Company;
- 14.1.9 the storage of the personal information with external storage and record management companies;
- 14.1.10 marketing of products and services;

- 14.1.11 to inform customers of products and services;
- 14.1.12 track visitor activity on our website and at the physical address from which the Company conducts its business;
- 14.1.13 the storage of Information using a secure cloud-based storage solution;
- 14.1.14 to verify the accuracy, correctness, completeness of any information provided to the Company; and
- 14.1.15 any matter ancillary thereto.

15 CATEGORIES OF RECIPIENTS FOR PROCESSING THE PERSONAL INFORMATION

15.1 The Company may, subject to authorisation in terms of any applicable legislation, in terms of any contract or with the Data Subject's consent, share relevant Information of the Data Subject with:

- 15.1.1 any statutory bodies, regulators or judicial commissions (i.e. the Information Regulator, any ombudsman etc.);
- 15.1.2 South African Revenue Services;
- 15.1.3 Company employees;
- 15.1.4 Shareholders;
- 15.1.5 service providers rendering accounting and auditing services;
- 15.1.6 service providers rendering IT, hosting and cyber security services;
- 15.1.7 Third-party verification services conducting security checks and credit bureaus;
- 15.1.8 legal counsel of the Company;
- 15.1.9 Insurance underwriters;
- 15.1.10 Banks and other financial institutions;
- 15.1.11 brokers, advisers, or intermediaries;
- 15.1.12 collection agencies;
- 15.1.13 a service provider rendering any service to the Company;
- 15.1.14 service providers who capture, organize and store data; and
- 15.1.15 a third party when required by law or authorized by court order.

15.2 The Information will be shared in compliance with the legal obligation of the Company to protect the integrity and confidentiality of the Data Subject's Information and only to the extent absolutely necessary to achieve the purposes detailed in clause 14

15.3 The sharing of a Data Subject's Information will be subject to the obligation of confidentiality by virtue of the position held by the person with whom the Information is shared or where such person's position does not impose such an obligation of confidentiality, in terms of a declaration of secrecy which the Company shall secure with such person.

16 ACTUAL OR PLANNED TRANSBORDER FLOWS OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

16.1 The Company will process and store Information in a manner which may result in the trans-border flow of a Data Subject's Information outside of the Republic of South Africa for the purposes of, inter alia, cloud-based storage.

16.2 The Company shall only transfer the Information outside of the borders of the Republic of South Africa where:

16.2.1 the recipient is subject to law, binding corporate rules or a binding agreement secured by the Company, which provides the Data Subject's Information with the same or a greater degree of protection than that provided by POPI;

16.2.2 the data subject has consented to the transfer;

16.2.3 the transfer is in terms of an agreement between the Company and the Data Subject or is done at the request of the Data Subject;

16.2.4 the transfer is necessary for the performance by the Company of contractual obligations with a third party, which contract was concluded in the interest of the Data Subject; OR

16.2.5 the transfer is for the benefit of the Data Subject and it is not reasonably practicable for the Company to obtain the Data Subject's consent, but it is likely that the Data Subject would have consented to the transfer if they had the opportunity to consent.

17 INFORMATION SECURITY MEASURES

17.1 Diopoint employs up-to-date technology to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the Personal Information under its care. Some measures include:

- Network Security Controls
- Virus & Malware protection
- Password Controls
- Disaster Recovery and Backup policy and measures
- Service Provider and OEM Agreements
- Software License Management

17.2 While the Company has taken such steps to protect the Data Subject's Information, there is no method of data security and storage which is completely protected against data breaches. Should any data breach occur which involves the Information of a Data Subject, the Company will advise the Data Subject, the Information Regulator and relevant law enforcement agencies. The Company will provide the Data Subject with the necessary information and advice relating to the data breach and the steps that can be taken to mitigate the consequences of the data breach.

18 RETENTION OF RECORDS

18.1 The Company retains Information in terms of legislation listed above for the relevant periods as provided in the applicable legislation.

18.2 All Information collected by the Company will only be kept for as long as the Company is required by law or contractual obligation, to keep such Information, whereafter the Information will be destroyed in accordance with the procedure as detailed in clause 19 below.

19 DESTRUCTION OF PRIVATE AND CONFIDENTIAL RECORDS

When destroying Information, the Company makes use of such methods which shall render the Information unintelligible and incapable of reconstruction, which could include the shredding or incineration of all documents containing Information.

20 REQUEST TO ACCESS INFORMATION PROCEDURE

20.1 Request for access, change or removal of information can be made by email, addressed to the Information Officer at data.protection@diopoint.co.za.

20.2 Any person has the right to request details of Information and records held by the Company and copies of such records and Information, subject to the grounds for refusal stipulated in clause 21 below.

20.3 To obtain access to Information held by the Company, the requester must complete Form 2 of the PAIA Regulations ("Request for Access to Record") in full and submit the completed form to the Information Officer detailed above, together with proof of payment of the fee payable as prescribed in terms of PAIA. Forms are available on the Information Regulator Website. (<https://info regulator.org.za/popia>)

20.4 The requester must complete the form and submit it with a payment of a request fee and a deposit if applicable. The prescribed form must be completed in such a way that the Information Officer can identify:

- The record/s requested
- The Identity of the requester
- What form of access is required and
- The postal address and email of the requester

20.5 If a requester is unable to complete the Information Request Form due to illiteracy or disability, the request may be made verbally to the Information Officer.

20.6 If the request is made on behalf of another person, proof must be submitted of the capacity in which the requester is making the request and their authority to do so.

20.7 Proper identification must be provided before any information will be disclosed. The Company may take further steps to confirm the authority and identity of the requester. Documents for Identity verification:

- Driver's Licence
- Passport
- Identity Document
- Other official government documents to verify identity

20.8 The Information Officer will provide a response as soon as reasonably possible after receipt of the correctly completed Information Request Form, but by no later than 30 days after the request has been received, subject to clause 20.9 below.

20.9 The Information Officer may extend the 30 (thirty) day period contemplated in clause 20.8 above, by a further 30 (thirty) days on written notice to the requester, where:

20.9.1 the request is for a large number of records or requires a search through a large number of records and compliance with the original period would unreasonably interfere with the activities of the Company;

20.9.2 the request requires a search for records in, or collection thereof from, an office of the Company not situated in the same town or city as the office of the head that cannot reasonably be completed within the original period;

20.9.3 consultation among divisions of the Company or with another private body is necessary or desirable to decide upon the request that cannot reasonably be completed within the original period; and/or

20.9.4 the requester consents in writing to such extension.

20.10 If the Information Officer grants the request for access to Information, the Information Officer will advise the requester of the fees payable for access to the requested Information (if any) and the form in which access will be given.

20.11 The fees payable for access to information are prescribed in terms of PAIA and are detailed in clause 22 below.

20.12 The Information Officer may refuse a request on the grounds stipulated in clause 21 below. In the event that the Information Officer refuses a request for access to Information, the Information Officer shall provide the requester with written reasons for the refusal.

20.13 In the event that:

20.13.1 the Information Officer fails to respond within the 30 (thirty) day period or the extended period as contemplated in clause 20.8;

20.13.2 the requesters request is refused; or

20.13.3 the requester is dissatisfied with the access fee to be paid, the form of access granted, and / or the procedure for obtaining access,

the requester may within 180 days of the expiry of the 30 day period, where the Information Officer has failed to respond, OR within 180 days of receipt by the requester of the notification of the decision of the Information Officer, submit a complaint to the Information Regulator or apply to any Magistrates' Court having jurisdiction, for relief.

20.14 Where a requester has been granted access to Information, the requester may submit a request to the Information Officer to correct or delete such Information where the Information is inaccurate, irrelevant, excessive, out of date, incomplete, misleading or was obtained unlawfully. Such request must be submitted on prescribed Form 2 of the POPI Regulations, which is available on request from the Information Officer.

21 GROUNDS FOR REFUSAL TO ACCESS TO RECORDS- CHAPTER 4 OF PAIA

21.1 A request to access Information must be refused by the Company on the following grounds:

21.1.1 Mandatory protection of the privacy of a third party who is natural person;

21.1.2 Mandatory protection of the commercial information of a third party;

21.1.3 Mandatory protection of certain confidential information of a third party;

21.1.4 Mandatory protection of safety of individuals, and protection of property;

21.1.5 Mandatory protection of records privileged from production in legal proceedings;

21.1.6 Commercial information of a private body; and

21.1.7 Mandatory protection of research information of a third party, and protection of research information of a private body;

21.2 The Information Officer has the discretion to refuse access to Information on the following grounds:

21.2.1 the disclosure of such Information relating to a third party would prejudice the supply of similar information in the future;

21.2.2 where the record contains information around crime prevention, detection and prosecution of alleged offenders;

21.2.3 where the disclosure would unreasonably reveal consultative material obtained on account of deliberations over formulation of policy, exercise of power or performance of a duty; or

21.2.4 where the request is frivolous or vexatious.
